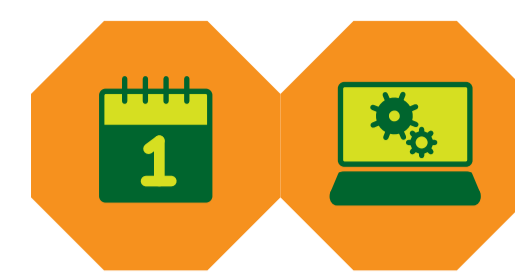

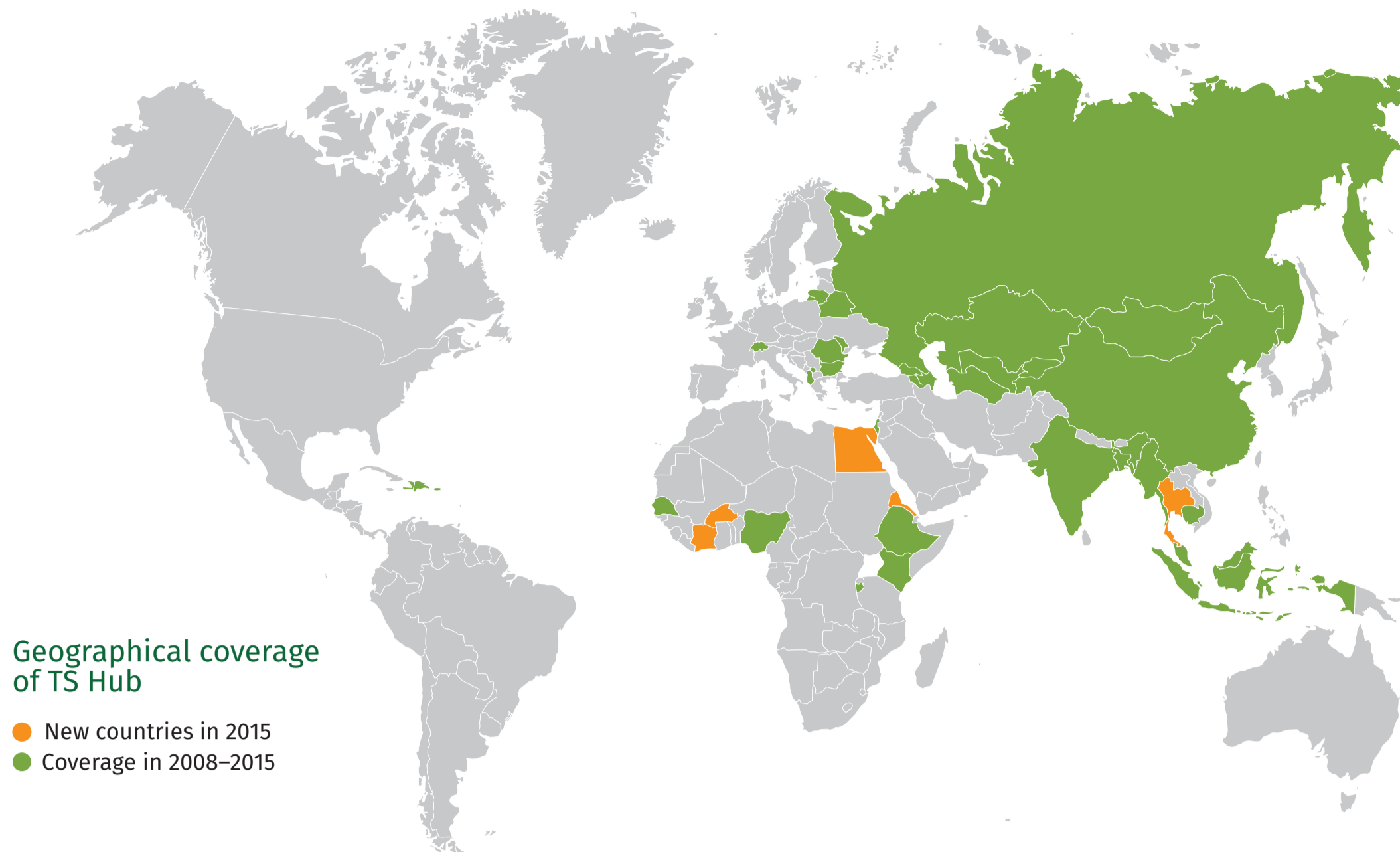

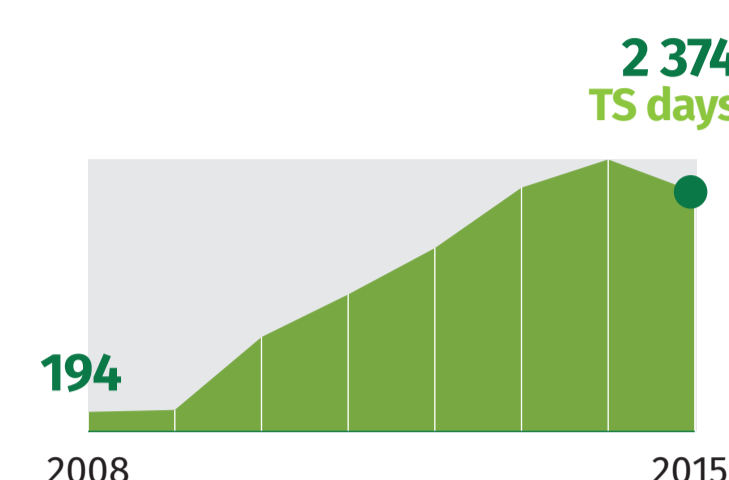

Long-term projects

Community action on Harm Reduction (CAHR)



Donor: International HIV/AIDS Alliance; Ministry of Foreign Affairs (the Netherlands).

TS recipients: representatives of vulnerable groups and organizations and NGOs in China, India, Indonesia, Kenya, Malaysia and Myanmar.

- Publication: *Employing people who use drugs in harm reduction; Access to Care and Treatment for People Who Inject Drugs.*
- Piloting the Peer Driven Intervention (PDI) in Indonesia and conducted trainings. The aim was to prepare participants for implementation of PDI at their respective sites and to train them in using SyrEx PDI database for tracking coupons and rewards.
- CAHR programme was widely presented during the 24th International Harm Reduction Conference.

Two rounds of survey within the National Immunization Campaign against Poliomyelitis in Ukraine



Donor: WHO in Ukraine.

- Each round covered 15 regions with three towns, some of which were overlapped in the course of survey. During the monitoring surveyors had to visit one medical establishment in each assigned region, which in general constituted 45 vaccination rooms, and to examine 25 parents of children aged from 2 months to 6 years old (1125 in total).
- The results of the survey are the following: all the medical establishments use the guidelines and policies adopted by the Ministry of Health; the vaccine is kept in appropriate conditions and parents are well informed regarding immunization. Nevertheless, the coverage of children vaccinated constituted about 50%.
- In mid-January 2016, the third round is planned.

Data Quality Project



Donor: International HIV/AIDS Alliance.

TS recipients: Khana in Cambodia, ACC in China, Alliance Myanmar, ABS in Burundi, CHAU in Uganda, OSSA in Ethiopia, KANCO in Kenya, ANCS in Senegal, IPC in Burkina Faso, and ANS-CI in Cote d'Ivoire.

- The aim: building capacity among Customer's LOs.
- Review and analysis of all M&E documents (M&E plan, performance frameworks for each project, strategic plan, data collection forms, etc).
- SyrEx cloud training on using unique identification codes (UICs) for tracking service & commodity provision.

LinkUp Database management system



Donor: International HIV/AIDS Alliance; Ministry of Foreign Affairs (the Netherlands).

TS recipients: partner organisations in 5 countries.

- TS visits were held in all of the project countries in order to set up the database, develop a general monitoring system and train the project partners to use SyrEx.
- International HIV/AIDS Alliance Secretariat assessment visits were held within the LinkUp project and showed high precision and reliability of the data input and the indicators' values.

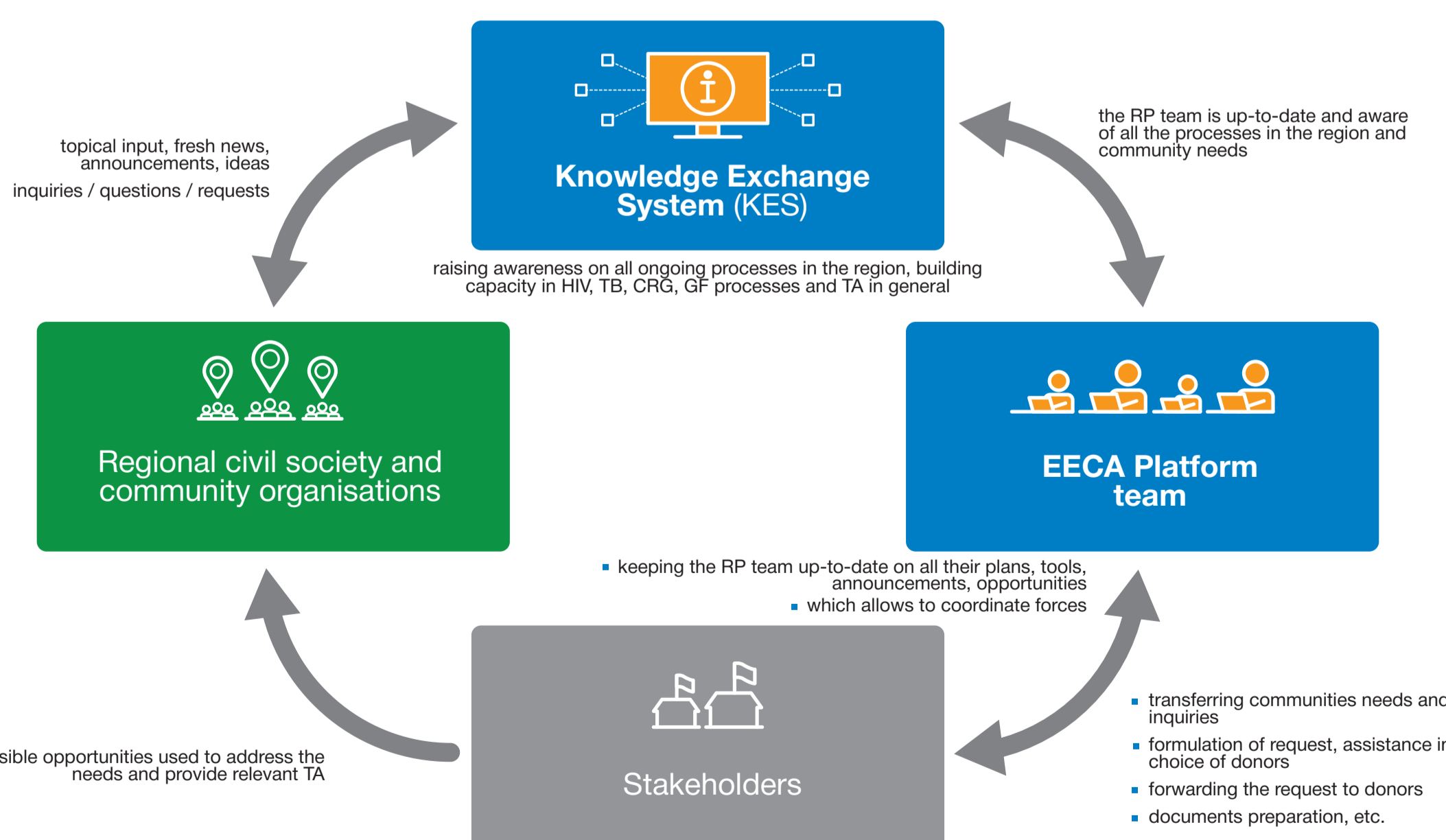


Innovations and development

GF – Regional Platform



- RP has brought together key community networks and TA providers in the EECA region to increase capacity and engagement of communities on GF processes, TA provision and fighting AIDS and TB.
- TB related questions were included to the regional agenda as actions towards integration of HIV and TB responses, taken together with TBEC.
- RP supported Anton Basenko, member of PWUD, ENPUD, INPUD Board, to successfully apply to the Community Delegation to the Board of the GF. Anton also successfully applied for Stakeholder Task Force of UN General Assembly President for the 2016 High Level Meeting on AIDS/HIV 2016.



International Harm Reduction Academy



- The Harm Reduction Academy was launched in 2015. The first three modules were presented in Kuala Lumpur to the organizations – potential users, prospective donors and state stakeholders. The presented initiative received a positive feedback from all the stakeholders; around 150 applicants submitted their requests for scholarship before the end of 2015. One of the prospective donor's companies (Exchange Supply) committed to paying for one scholarship.
